Source and Goal (CCC 1076-1083)

He has His "providential plan" (GDC 37), our participation in Trinitarian life for all eternity.

The Son



Redeemer and Mediator (CCC 1084-1090)

He makes the "providential plan" effective by the saving events of the Paschal Mystery. (CCC 1085)

The Paschal Mystery

(The saving events of Christ's passion, death, resurrection, and ascension.)

- 1. Christ *shows* us God's love for us. (Jn 3:16-17; Jn 15:13; 1 Jn 4:10)
- 2. Christ models holiness for us. (Jn 13:13-15; Phil 2:5-8; CT 9)
- 3. Christ saves us from sin and reconciles us to the Father. (Rom 5:8; 1 Pet 3:18; 1 Jn 3:16.)
- 4. Christ *makes* it possible for us to be partakers of the divine life. (2 Pet 1:3-4; 1 Jn 3:2; 2 Cor 3:18.)

(See also CCC 457-460, the reasons for the Incarnation.)

The Accomplishments of the Paschal Mystery

- 1. The fullness of revelation 1 Jn 4:9 "love made manifest...so that...we can live through Him." (CCC 516)
- 2. The redemption of mankind and reconciliation with the Father-Eph 1:7 - "redemption... according to the riches of his grace." (CCC 517)
- 3. The *recapitulation* of all creation under the Lordship of Jesus Eph 1:10 – "the plan...to unite all things in Him, things in heaven and on earth." (CCC 518)



The Holy Spirit



Lord and Giver of Life – (CCC 1091-1109)

He effects the "providential plan" in our lives. He makes the deposit of grace accessible for us in the Church.

The Church



Makes Abundantly Available

Dispenser of the Mysteries – (CCC 774-776, 1088, 1104) (Eph 3:9-10, 1 Cor 2:7-9, Col 1:26-27; cf. 1 Cor 4:1)

She makes all the works of Christ in the events of the Paschal Mystery available abundantly in the liturgy and sacraments. She is necessary for our salvation.

The Sacred Liturgy

Sacrifice of the Mass, seven sacraments, liturgical year, liturgy of the hours, sacramentals.

The Four Reasons for the Incarnation

- (see CCC 457-460; The four reasons point to the saving events of the Paschal Mystery: His Passion, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension.)

The Word became flesh...

- 1) ...in order to save us by reconciling us with God. To take away our sins 1 Jn 3:5 ... by reconciling us to the Father - 1 Jn 4:10, 14
- 2) ... so that we might know God's love. God so loved the World that ... In 3:16 God's love is made manifest in that He sent the Son - 1 Jn 4:9
- 3) ... to be our model of holiness. I am the Way, the Truth, & the Life ... In 14:16 Take my yoke upon you ... - Mt 11:29
- 4) ... to make us partakers of the divine nature. ... and become partakers of the divine nature 2 Pt 1:4 The plan of the mystery... Christ in you, the Hope of Glory - Col 1:26-27 "The Son of God became man, so that we might become God." - St. Thomas Aquinas

... are accomplished in the Paschal Mystery, so that ...

- 1) The fullness of revelation is delivered "...the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through Him." - 1 Jn 4:9*
- 2) Humanity is redeemed and reconciled with the Father. "In Him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace."--Eph 1:7*
- 3) All creation can be recapitulated under the Lordship of Jesus Christ. "...a plan for the fullness of to unite all things in Him, things in heaven and things on earth." -- Eph 1:10* (* see CCC 516-517)

"The Church, united with her Lord and 'in the Holy Spirit', blesses the Father 'for His inexpressible gift' in her adoration, praise, and thanksgiving." (CCC 1077-1083)



"Through the liturgy Christ, our redeemer and high priest, continues the work of redemption in, with, and through his Church." (CCC 1069)

The liturgy is a participation in Christ's own prayer addressed to the Father in the Holy Spirit. (CCC 1084-1090)




The Spirit and the Church cooperate to manifest Christ and His work of salvation in the liturgy. (CCC 1091-1109)






Lord and Giver of Life
